

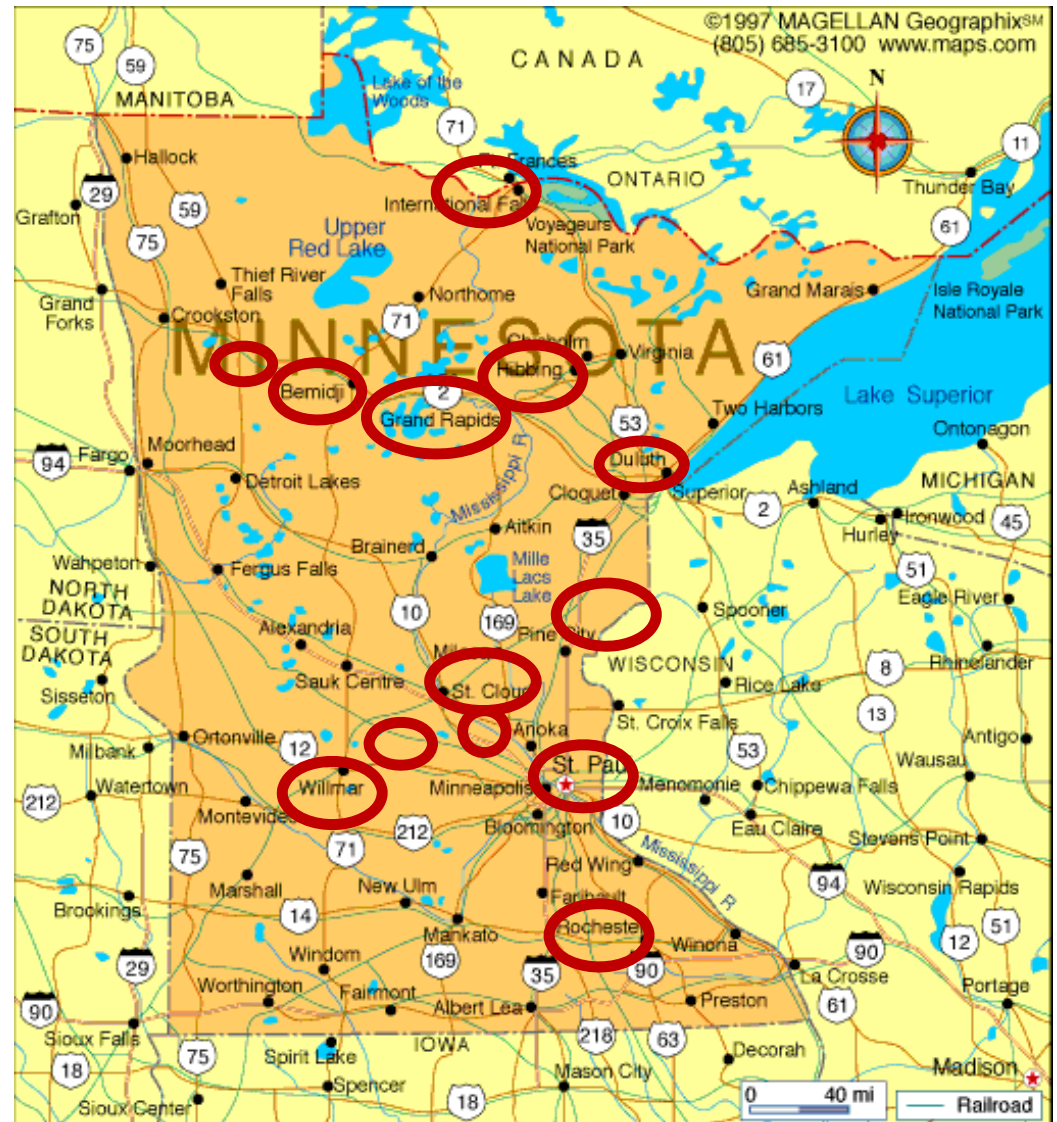

The mission for the Minnesota IAFN Chapter is to develop and promote excellence in forensic nursing through education and collaborative partnerships.

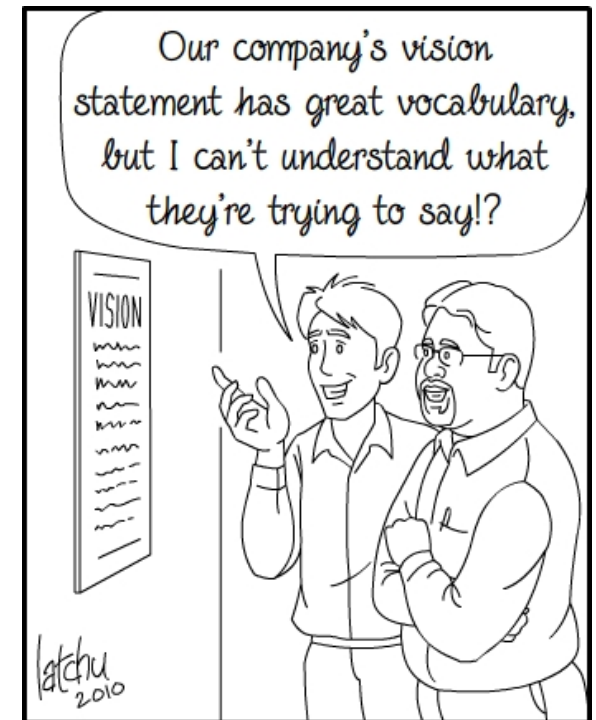
